54TH YEAR AT SAINT VINCENT COLLEGE



2019 TRAINING CAMP HIGHLIGHTS

The Steelers are celebrating their 54th Training Camp at Saint Vincent College in Latrobe, Pa., this summer.

Pittsburgh has called Saint Vincent College its “summer home” since 1966.

Through their first three decades in the NFL, the Steelers held their training camps at a variety of locations, as far east as New England and as far west as Wisconsin. In 1966, for the third straight summer, training camp for the Steelers was at the University of Rhode Island.

The team was there through the first four weeks of a five-game preseason schedule. Then, after a loss in Green Bay to Vince Lombardi’s Packers, Coach Bill Austin wanted the team closer to Pittsburgh because the 1966 regular season was due to open with a home game against the New York Giants on Sept. 11.

With no practice fields of their own at the time, the Steelers turned to Saint Vincent College. The team arrived in Latrobe on Aug. 29 and spent a couple of weeks on campus going through final preparations for the 1966 regular season.

In 1967, the Steelers conducted their entire training camp at Saint Vincent College.



The Steelers officially kicked off the 2019 season when the team reported to training camp on July 25 at Saint Vincent College in Latrobe, Pa.

The team’s 2019 training camp includes 15 practices open to the public - including the annual night practice at Latrobe Memorial Stadium (Aug. 2).

STEELERS HALL OF HONOR

The Steelers announced their 2019 Hall of Honor class on Saturday, July 27 at the Fred Rogers Center on the campus of Saint Vincent College. Four members were announced in this year’s class.

The 2019 class includes the following (in alphabetical order):

- Larry Brown: Tight End/Tackle (1971-84)
- Bill Cowher: Head Coach (1992-2006)
- Elbie Nickel: Tight End (1947-57)
- Hines Ward: Wide Receiver (1998-2011)

The 2019 Steelers Hall of Honor Induction ceremony will be held on Sunday, Sept. 29, at Heinz Field, the weekend the Steelers host the Cincinnati Bengals on Monday Night Football (Sept. 30). Each inductee will receive a replica of a solid steel football, which will replicate the original that was given to Steelers’ founder Arthur J. Rooney Sr. by the United States Steel Corporation and United Steel Workers in 1982 on the occasion of the team’s 50th Season.

The Steelers’ Hall of Honor, established with its inaugural class of 27 members in 2017, is comprised of former players, coaches, and front office personnel who were integral in creating and sustaining the franchise’s success dating back to when the team was founded in 1933.

The Hall of Honor Selection Committee consists of Steelers President Art Rooney II, Joe Gordon, Bob Labriola, Stan Savran, Andrew Stockey, and Tony Quatrini.

CAMPING OUT

The Steelers are in their 54th consecutive year of preseason training camp at Saint Vincent College in Latrobe, Pa.

Pittsburgh’s 54-year tenure at the college is the second longest in the NFL for training camp longevity.

Only the Green Bay Packers, who have held their preseason camp at St. Norbert College in DePere, Wisc., have maintained a longer summer home for 62 years.

2019 SCHEDULE NOTES



The Steelers are slated to appear in five nationally-televised primetime games, including two Monday Night Football games at Heinz Field, during the NFL's 2019 regular season, it was announced this spring when the NFL unveiled its 2019 regular season schedule.

Pittsburgh will kick off its 2019 regular season on Sunday Night Football at the New England Patriots in Week 1 on Sunday, Sept. 8 (NBC, 8:20 p.m.). The Steelers will host the Seattle Seahawks in Week 2 of the 2019 regular season at Heinz Field for their home opener on Sunday, Sept. 15 (FOX, 1 p.m.).

The Steelers will host the Cincinnati Bengals and Miami Dolphins on Monday Night Football at Heinz Field in 2019, in Weeks 4 and 8 (ESPN, 8:15 p.m.), respectively. Pittsburgh's two other nationally televised primetime games are scheduled for Sunday Night Football at the Los Angeles Chargers in Week 6 on Oct. 13 (NBC, 8:20 p.m.) and a Thursday Night Football game at the Cleveland Browns in Week 11 on Nov. 14 (FOX/NFL Network/Amazon, 8:20 p.m.).

The Steelers' bye week will be on Oct. 20 (Week 7).

STEELERS 2019 DRAFT CLASS

LB Devin Bush (5-11, 225)

Rd. 1 10th Overall

Played in 39 games, 32 starts, at Michigan as a three-year letterman...a two-time Academic All-Big Ten Conference member (2017-18)...registered 194 tackles, 20.0 tackles for losses, 10.0 sacks, one interception and 17 passes defended in his Wolverines career.

WR Dontae Johnson (5-11, 181)

Rd. 3 66th Overall

Totaled 137 receptions for 2,276 yards and 24 touchdowns in 38 games played at Toledo...ranks fifth in school history in touchdown receptions...returned 79 kickoffs (1,849 yards) for a 23.4 return average and two touchdowns and 17 punt returns (243 yards) with two return scores.

CB Justin Layne (6-3, 185)

Rd. 3 83rd Overall

Three-year letterwinner, playing in 34 games (26 starts) at cornerback for Michigan State...recorded 130 career tackles, including 4.5 tackles for loss and a half-sack...added 24 career passes defended and three interceptions...began his Spartans' career as a wide receiver before transitioning to cornerback midway through his 2016 season.

RB Benny Snell Jr. (5-10, 224)

Rd. 4 122nd Overall

Started 27 of 39 games at Kentucky...broke or tied 14 school records, including career rushing yards (3,873), total touchdowns (48), rushing touchdowns (48) and 100-yard games (19)...ranks second on program rushing attempts (737) and third on all-time scoring (290) charts...scored his 40th touchdown in just 31 games, the second fastest in SEC history to do so...became first Wildcat to amass 1,000-yards in a season three times.

TE Zach Gentry (6-7, 248)

Rd. 5 141st Overall

Three-year letter winner at Michigan, playing in 33 games with 24 starts at tight end...recorded 49 catches for 817 yards and four touchdowns in his career...earned U-M Athletic Academic Achievement...switched to tight end from quarterback prior to sophomore season.

LB Sutton Smith (6-1, 237)

Rd. 6 237th Overall

Became the first two-time first team All-American in Northern Illinois football history...two-time MAC Defensive Player of the Year (2017 and 2018)...ranks third all-time in program history in sacks (30.0) and second in tackles for loss (58).

DE Isaiah Buggs

Rd. 6 192nd Overall

Played in 29 games at Alabama from 2017-18, producing 102 total tackles (44 solo), 11.0 sacks, 17.5 tackles for loss, three passes defended, two forced fumbles and one fumble recovery...transferred to Alabama from Mississippi Gulf Coast Community College where he earned All-MACJC South Division honors in 2015 and 2016.

Rd. 7 219th Overall

Appeared in 35 games at Maryland, making 25 starts.

RB James Conner became the first player in franchise history with at least 1,000 yards from scrimmage and 10 total touchdowns in the first eight games of a season in 2018.

LB T.J. Watt recorded two 3.0 sack games in 2018 - Kickoff Weekend at Cleveland and Week 5 vs. Atlanta - the second and third multi-sack games of his NFL career.

The Steelers' defense totaled 7 sacks (**LB T.J. Watt**: 3.0, **LB Jon Bostic**: 1.0, **LB Bud Dupree**: 1.0 **NT Javon Hargrave** and **DT Cameron Heyward**: 1.0) on Kickoff Weekend - the team's third consecutive regular-season game with at least five quarterback takedowns, dating back to Dec. 25, 2017 at Houston.

RB James Conner became the eighth player in Steelers history (13th occasion) to score at least 10 rushing touchdowns in a season with his 10th of 2018 in Week 10 against Carolina.

24-52

The Steelers held opponents to 24 sacks in 2018 - the fourth-fewest allowed in the NFL - and recorded 52 sacks in 2018 - tied as the most in the NFL (Kansas City).

34-452-5,129

QB Ben Roethlisberger set single-season team records for touchdown passes (34), pass completions (452) and passing yards (5,129) in 2018.

50

HC Mike Tomlin earned his 50th regular-season win against an AFC North Opponent in Week 9 at Baltimore. The Steelers are one of two teams (New England) with at least 50 divisional game wins in the Mike Tomlin era, since 2007.

52

The Steelers set a Heinz Field record for the most points in an NFL game with 52 on Thursday Night Football in Week 10 vs. Carolina.

54

Pittsburgh established a single-season team record with 54 total touchdowns in 2018 (1979: 52).

73.5

Pittsburgh finished first in the NFL with a 73.5 red zone touchdown scoring efficiency in 2018, converting 36-of-49 red zone drives for touchdowns.

112

TE Vance McDonald set a single-game career high and recorded the first 100-receiving yard game of his NFL career with 112 yards, including a 75-yard touchdown catch on Monday Night Football in Week 3.

PITTSBURGH, Pa. – The Steelers were unable to overcome a 21-point deficit in their 42-37 loss to the Kansas City Chiefs at Heinz Field.

Three straight touchdown passes from Chiefs QB Patrick Mahomes gave Kansas City a 21-0 lead by the end of the first quarter, but the second quarter belonged to the Steelers as Pittsburgh rattled off three-straight touchdowns of their own to tie the game at 21-21 going into the second half.

The Chiefs pulled ahead again at the start of the second half when Mahomes connected TE Travis Kelce in the end zone for a 25-yard touchdown. In the series that followed, Pittsburgh orchestrated an 11-play, 75-yard drive that culminated in a 1-yard touchdown run by Steelers **RB James Conner**.

With the game tied at 28-28, Kansas City racked up two more scores, giving the Chiefs a 14-point lead early in the fourth quarter.

The Steelers cut that lead by two when **CB Artie Burns** and S Morgan Burnett tackled Mahomes in the Chiefs' end zone for a safety.

Just after the two-minute warning, the Steelers put seven more points on the scoreboard when **QB Ben Roethlisberger** found the end zone on a 3-yard rush, but with time winding down, the Pittsburgh was unable to overcome its five-point deficit and fell to the Chiefs 42-37.

TE Jesse James produced a single-game career high and led all receivers with 138 receiving yards on five receptions and a touchdown. His 138 receiving yards mark the first 100-receiving yard game of his NFL career. **WR JuJu Smith-Schuster** finished with 13 catches for 121 yard and a touchdown.

Pittsburgh converted two of its four two-point attempts in 2017, and three of its nine tries in 2016, their first two conversions both coming in the first quarter of games (Oct. 2 vs. Kansas City and Oct. 16 at Miami).

Mike Tomlin became the third head coach in Steelers history to record 100 regular season wins in Week 14 of 2016, with the team's 27-20 victory at Buffalo.

He joined Chuck Noll (1969-91: 193) and Bill Cowher (1992-2006: 149) in the team's 100-win club to make the Steelers the first NFL franchise with three 100-win head coaches.

Tomlin earned his 100th regular-season victory in Week 14 of 2016 at Buffalo in his 157th career regular-season games to mark the fewest games by a Steelers head coach to reach the century mark in the win column (Chuck Noll: 158 and Bill Cowher: 163).

Tomlin's 100th win occurred in his 10th season with the Steelers, becoming the first Pittsburgh head coach to reach 100 wins in his first 10 years (Bill Cowher: 1992-2001: 99 and Chuck Noll: 1976-78: 88).

Tomlin also joined an elite head coach fraternity in NFL history by reaching 100 wins in his 10th season:

Roethlisberger earned 117 wins in his first 175 regular-season starts - the second-most by an NFL QB in League history through 175 starts (Tom Brady: 136).

Roethlisberger made his 150th career regular-season start in Week 8 vs. Indianapolis in 2014 to become just the fourth quarterback in NFL history to record 100 wins in their first 150 regular season starts (Tom Brady: 116, Joe Montana: 108, Terry and Bradshaw: 102).

Roethlisberger registered his 90th career win in his 135th career start, becoming the fifth-fastest quarterback who began their career in the Super Bowl era to reach 90 wins.

THE 45 AND 50,000 CLUB

QB Ben Roethlisberger became the eighth quarterback in NFL history - first in team history - to reach 50,000 passing yards in regular-season career games - a feat he accomplished in Week 13 of 2017 at Cincinnati. He reached 50,000 passing yards in his 197th regular-season game to become the fifth quarterback in NFL history to reach the milestone in fewer than 200 games.

Roethlisberger became the first player in Steelers history to register 45,000 career passing yards in Week 10's game vs. Dallas. He was the 11th quarterback in NFL history to reach the mark, the eighth to do so with one team, and the fourth active signal caller with 45,000 passing yards.

BEN GOING OVER 90

WR JuJu Smith-Schuster established single-season career highs for receptions (111) and receiving yards (1,426) in 2018, leading the Steelers' offense in both categories. He opened the 2018 season with three consecutive 100-receiving yard games, and added a sixth of the year with a 189-yard performance in Week 12 at Denver.

In Week 1, Smith-Schuster finished with a game-high 119 yards on five catches, and hauled in a single-game career best 13 grabs for 121 yards and a touchdown in Week 2 vs. Kansas City. In Week 3 on Monday Night Football at Tampa Bay, he led all receivers with nine receptions for 116 receiving yards.

CONNER STRONG



RB James Conner became the first player in team history with at least 1,000 scrimmage yards and 10 touchdowns in the team's first eight games of a season in 2018, and scored at least one touchdown in five straight games (Games 5-9).

Conner recorded three straight games with at least 100 rushing yards and two touchdowns in three consecutive games, Games 5-7, becoming the first player in Steelers history - and the first NFL player since 2009 (Chris Johnson) to tally three straight games with at least 100 rushing yards and two touchdowns.

Conner rushed for nine touchdowns in the first eight games of 2018, tied as the most by a Steeler through the first eight games of a season (Franco Harris, 1976) and his 1,085 yards from scrimmage are the second-most through eight games of a season in team history (Le'Veon Bell, 2014: 1,086).

Conner made the first start of his NFL career and set single-game career-highs for rushing yards (135), touchdowns (2 rushing), receptions (5), receiving yards (57) and scrimmage yards (192) on Kickoff Weekend of 2018 at Cleveland.

His 135 rushing yards marked the first 100-rushing yard game of his NFL career and the fourth-most by a Steeler on Kickoff Weekend, while his 192 scrimmage yards are the third-most by a Steeler on Kickoff Weekend in team history.

The second-year running back totaled 65 yards from scrimmage (17 rushing / 48 receiving) and scored his third career rushing touchdown and of 2018, and his first as a Steeler at Heinz Field, on a one-yard run, in Week 2 against Kansas City.

In Week 5 vs. Atlanta at Heinz Field, Conner tallied 185 yards from scrimmage (110 rushing / 75 receiving), to go along with two rushing touchdowns. He became the second Steeler to record at least 100 rushing yards, 75 receiving yards and two rushing touchdowns in a game since 1950, joining Franco Harris (Nov. 25, 1979 vs. Cleveland).

CONNER'S HONORS

RB James Conner earned AFC Offensive Player of the Week (Week 8) and AFC Offensive Player of the Month (October) honors.

In Week 8, Conner led all players in multiple categories, including yards from scrimmage (212), rushing yards (146) and rushing touchdowns (2), adding 5 catches for 66 yards in Week Eight's win vs. Cleveland at Heinz Field.

Conner led the AFC in rushing touchdowns (6), yards from scrimmage per game (175.3), rushing yards per game (122.3) and rushes of 10+ yards (13) in the month of October, while rushing for at least 100 yards and two touchdowns in each of his three October games – becoming the first player in Steelers history with a three-game streak of at least 100-rushing yards and two rushing touchdowns and the first NFL player to do so since 2009.

McDONALD'S CAREER YEAR

TE Vance McDonald, who recorded single-season career bests in receptions (50) and receiving yards (610) in 2018, set a single-game career high and registered the first 100-receiving yard game of his NFL regular season career with 112 receiving yards on four catches in Week 3 of 2018 at Tampa Bay on Monday Night Football.

He became the second Steelers tight end since 1960, to record at least 100 receiving yards in the first half of a game (Eric Green, Sept. 22, 1991, 118 yards). McDonald scored a touchdown on a 75-yard pass from **QB Ben Roethlisberger** in the first quarter, matching a career-long reception (75-yard touchdown while with San Francisco) in 2016 (Sept. 18 at Carolina).

In Week 6 at Cincinnati, McDonald set a single-game career best with seven catches (6, Nov. 29, 2015 vs. Arizona, while with San Francisco) for 68 yards.

LIMITING SACKS

The Steelers' offensive line limited opponents to 24 sacks in the 2018 season - the fourth-fewest allowed by any team on the season - and have held opponents to one or zero sacks in 10 of 16 games in 2018.

HARGRAVE AT THE NOSE

NT Javon Hargrave finished 12th among all NFL defensive tackles with 6.5 sacks in 2018. He produced the first multi-sack game of his NFL career, bringing down Jacksonville QB Blake Bortles (minus five and eight yards) twice in the second quarter in Week 11. He extended his single-season career high to 6.5 sacks in 2018 with a sack in Week 13 vs. Los Angeles, (2016 and 2017: 2.0), and his career quarterback takedown total to 10.5.

WILLIAMS ON THE 'D'

LB Vince Williams led all players with 12 tackles (4 solo), including a tackle for a loss in Week 1 of 2018 at Cleveland. His 12 tackles marked the second double-digit tackle game of his NFL career (15, Oct. 2, 2016 vs. Kansas City). In Week 6 at Cincinnati, Williams led the Steelers with 7 total tackles (6 solo) and tallied his first sack of the season.

In Week 10 vs. Carolina, Williams totaled 4 tackles (3 solo), including a sack of eight yards of Carolina QB Cam Newton. He picked off Carolina QB Cam Newton in the first quarter, his second career interception, and returned it 17 yards for a touchdown to mark the first pick-six of his NFL career.

Williams finished second on the Steelers' defense with 76 total tackles (50 solo) in 2018, and added 4.5 sacks and 8 tackles for losses, 10 quarterback hits, two passes defensed and an interception returned for a touchdown.

WATT'S 2018 CAMPAIGN

With a 2.0 sack outing at Jacksonville in Week 11 of 2018, **LB T.J. Watt** became the first Steelers linebacker with at least 10.0 sacks in a season since 2010 (James Harrison and LaMarr Woodley). Along with 7.0 sacks in his 2017 rookie campaign, Watt is the first Steelers linebacker since 2013-14 (Jason Worilds) to record back-to-back seasons with at least 7.0 sacks.

Watt finished Week 1 in Cleveland with 10 tackles (7 solo), 3.0 sacks (minus 16 yards) and a blocked field goal. He was named AFC Defensive Player of the Week for his Week 1 outing, becoming the first Steelers linebacker since 2010 (Lawrence Timmons, Week Six) to receive the honor.

Watt posted his second career and second game of 2018 with 3.0 sacks in Week 5 vs. Atlanta, the third multi-sack game of his NFL career. He forced a fumble on his third sack of Atlanta QB Matt Ryan, in the fourth quarter, which was recovered by LB L.J. Fort in the Falcons' end zone for a touchdown.

In the Steelers' regular-season finale vs. Cincinnati at Heinz Field, Watt totaled 7 tackles (4 solo) and two defensive forced fumbles on Cincinnati QB Jeff Driskel, including a strip-sack of Driskel (minus 6 yards) at the Bengals' 12-yard line in the third quarter. His defensive forced fumbles marked the fifth and sixth defensive forced fumbles of his 2018 season and increased his career total to seven to become the first Steeler with at least six defensive forced fumbles in a season since 2010 (James Harrison: 6).

Watt started his regular-season career in historical fashion. He became the first player to record at least 2.0 sacks and an interception in an NFL debut on Kickoff Weekend since sacks became an official statistic in 1982, finishing with 6 tackles, 2.0 sacks, two tackles for losses, one quarterback hit and one interception. With his 2.0 sack and one interception performance, Watt became:

- Third player in NFL history to record 2.0 sacks and an interception in an NFL debut, joining Charles Glaze (Oct. 4, 1987) and Tommy Haynes (Oct. 4, 1987).
- First Steeler with at least 2.0 sacks in their NFL debut since sacks became an official statistic in 1982 (previous mark, 1.5, Kenny Davidson, Sept. 9, 1990 at Cleveland).
- First Steeler with at least 2.0 sacks and an interception in the same game since 2010 (LaMarr Woodley, Dec. 12 vs. Cincinnati).

HADEN BREAKING IT UP



CB Joe Haden hauled in his third interception as a Steeler, picking off New England QB Tom Brady in the fourth quarter at the Steelers' 4-yard line in Week 15, his the 22nd interception of his NFL career and his second in 2018. Haden led all defenders in the game with a game high 12 total tackles (8 solo), two passes defended to go along with his interception.

Haden, a two-time Pro Bowl selection, made his Steelers debut, appearing in the 91st game of his NFL regular-season career and posted six tackles and 1.0 sack, on Kickoff Weekend of 2017 at the Cleveland Browns. He brought down Cleveland QB DeShone Kizer for a sack of three yards to end the first half – his first sack with the Steelers – third of his NFL career – and first since Sept. 11, 2011 (with Cleveland). In Week 7 vs. Cincinnati, Haden hauled in the 20th interception of his NFL career and his first as a Steeler, picking off Cincinnati QB Andy Dalton in the third quarter.

Since entering the NFL in 2010, Haden has recorded 120 passes defended - the second-most among all NFL defenders:

The University of Florida product was a first-round (seventh overall) draft selection of the Browns in 2010. He has started 107-of-116 games played in the NFL and his career numbers include 452 tackles (367 solo), 22 interceptions, 120 passes defended, four forced fumbles, four fumble recoveries and 3.0 sacks.

DAVIS: LAST MAN OF 'D'

S Sean Davis led the Steelers' defense for the second consecutive year in 2018, tallying 79 tackles (58 solo), to go along with an interception, seven passes defended and a quarterback hit, in his first season at the free safety position.

In Week 16 at New Orleans in 2018, Davis picked off New Orleans QB Taysom Hill in Pittsburgh's end zone in the first quarter, the fifth interception of his NFL career and his first of 2018.

Davis has recorded at least 8 total tackles in eight career regular-season games, including a 9 tackle (6 solo) outing in the Week 13 vs. Los Angeles in 2018.

The third-year defensive back recorded the first double-digit tackle games of his NFL career with 10 vs. New England in Week 15 of 2017, and tallied a career high 12 vs. Baltimore in Week 14 of 2017.

In the 2017 Week 17 regular season finale vs. Cleveland, Davis posted his sole sack of the season, and hauled in his third interception of the year.

HILTON MAKING AN IMPACT

CB Mike Hilton led Pittsburgh's defense with 8 total tackles (6 solo), 2 tackles for losses and a quarterback hit, along with a sack and defensive fumble recovery in Week 14 at Oakland. He recorded a sack of Oakland QB Derek Carr (minus 6 yards) in the second quarter, his first quarterback takedown of 2018 and the fifth of his NFL career, and recovered a fumble off of a team sack of Raiders QB Derek Carr in the third quarter.

He picked off Tampa Bay QB Ryan Fitzpatrick in the second quarter of a Week 3 Monday Night Football game at Tampa Bay at the Pittsburgh's 6-yard line – his first interception of 2018 – and the third of his NFL career. He also recovered a fumble in the second quarter, forced by **CB Artie Burns** on Tampa Bay WR Chris Godwin, marking the first defensive fumble recovery of his NFL career.

Hilton joined the Steelers' practice squad in December of 2016, and started four-of-16 games played with Pittsburgh in 2017, recording 54 tackles (42 solo), 4.0 sacks, two interceptions, eight quarterback hits and 10 tackles for losses and six passes defended.

DEFENSIVE ADDITIONS

Pittsburgh signed two key additions to the defense this offseason, adding from **CB Steven Nelson** the Chiefs and **LB Mark Barron** from the Rams.

In his four-year NFL career, Nelson has started 38-of-52 regular-season and four-of-six postseason games, all with Kansas City. His career totals include 174 tackles (150 solo), four interceptions, 35 passes defended, 8 tackles for losses, two fumble recoveries and one forced fumble.

In 104 regular-season games (93 starts) starts with Tampa Bay (2012-14) and the Los Angeles Rams (2014-18), the University of Alabama product has career totals including 618 tackles (473 solo), 9.0 sacks, eight interceptions, 39 passes defended, 17 quarterback hits, 44 tackles for losses, five forced fumbles and three fumble recoveries.

WIZARD OF BOZ



Since joining the Steelers in 2015, **K Chris Boswell** is 98-of-115 overall on field goal attempts (85.2%), including 34-of-44 (77.3%) between 40-49 yards. Boswell converted a 48-yard field goal with 2:30 remaining in regulation, increasing the Steelers' lead to 17-10, in Week 16 against New England.

His 85.2 field goal percent ranks second in Steelers history among kickers with at least 30 field goal attempts:

K Chris Boswell converted four field goals from 50 yards or further in 2017 - the most by a Steelers kicker in a single-season.

Boswell has made seven-of-nine field goal attempts in his NFL career from 50 yards or further, including a 50-yard try in Week 10 of 2018 at Heinz Field against Carolina.

His seven field goals made from 50-plus yards are the third-most in Steelers history (Gary Anderson and Jeff Reed: eight).

A LAND DOWN IN THE 20

P Jordan Berry pinned opponents inside their 20-yard line 16 times during the 2018 regular season, punting 63 times (2,753 yards) for a 43.7 average on the season.
